

Sparklers add flair and fun to July 4th celebrations large and small. However, sparklers burn at a temperature of approximately 1,800° F and therefore, care must be taken to use them properly, especially around children.

Professor Sparkz offers some safety tips to keep your festivities fun and youngsters safe:

- Only use sparklers outside.
- Always have a sober adult in charge & never give fireworks to young children, even sparklers.
- Never light or hold more than one sparkler at a time.
- Always keep sparklers at arm's length away from the body.
- Stand at least six feet away from other people.
- Don't run with, throw, or hand a lit sparkler to someone else.

- Avoid loose fitting apparel, sparklers can ignite fabric and clothes could catch fire.
- Wear closed-toe shoes to help prevent from accidental foot burns.
- Douse spent sparklers in a bucket of water, the wire or bamboo sticks stay hot after the sparkler is done burning.
- After they cool, remember to dispose of sticks in a plastic waste bin; stepping on used sparklers can cause foot injuries.
